## About the Junior School

St Helen's Junior Department is a small department, with one Year 5 class of up to 16 students and one Year 6 class of up to 24 students. Our classrooms are nestled right in the heart of the School and provide our students with a supportive and enriching environment from which to begin their life at St Helen's.

Although two separate classes for academic subjects, we aim to foster a sense of belonging in our Junior students both as part of the Junior Department and as a member of the whole School community. Year 5 and Year 6 work together for a wide range of activities including clubs and events as well as the Junior Christmas celebration, Junior Residential and our Summer Production. Other events find the Junior students working alongside our Senior students; this interaction helps to nurture a sense of community throughout the school.

Our Junior students benefit from a team of dedicated staff committed to providing an enriching and happy learning environment for every student in our care. The small size of the department allows staff to get to know and understand individual requirements and the strengths of each child and, in doing so, can help each student to flourish.
